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more salaries and anything else that may help us understand why some of our wages have fallen below the poverty level and why our wages/ healthcare have not stayed competitive causing hiring and retention issues. This has greatly increased the workload on our remaining members and diminished the overall morale. This cannot continue! Hopefully with the new administration we can work towards a more productive and collaborative approach to our upcoming negotiations.

The second thing I would like to address is our elections that are coming up later in the year. We will have these positions open: President, Vice President, Secretary, Treasurer and three executive committee positions. With your vote we have a chance to keep moving in the right direction. I would like to see newly elected members involved with and committed to making sure we do a yearly audit, update our constitution and bylaws, and keep the membership informed through the newsletter and social engagement.

Finally, I would like to see everyone attend the general meeting. This meeting is to give our members a chance to see who is making decisions for them. It will also provide members a chance to ask questions to the Executive Committee and the negotiating team about our future.
